Diss Parish Conference

On 4th February 2011 a conference organised by Diss Town Council was held at the Diss Christian Community Church. Representatives from neighbouring parishes, community groups and businesses were invited to take part in a discussion on the way forward for local communities in the light of Government proposals outlined in the Localism Bill. The Bill advocates a redistribution of the power to make decisions and to deliver services, from central and regional government, to local communities. It states that this can be achieved by parish & town councils, voluntary organisations and neighbourhood groups working together to decide what is best for their local area.

The first speaker was MP Richard Bacon who spoke about the main principles of the Localism Bill and how it could benefit Diss and the surrounding area. Town Clerk, Deborah Sarson then described the services which could be provided in the local area by sharing resources with neighbouring parishes and other organisations.

Norfolk County Council's Head of Democratic Services, Chris Walton



spoke about the budget cuts and how these would impact on local services. He also outlined how the County Council is open to working with local organisations, including town and parish councils, to explore ways that services could be provided in the future.

The planning process was discussed by Brian Falk, a retired architect and planner, who spoke about Diss' current planning framework (the Local Plan) and the future plan for Diss (the Local Development Framework). He explained the benefits of developing a Neighbourhood Plan which would allow representatives from the local community to shape where new homes are built and

identify priorities for community facilities and public spaces.

Finally thanks are owed to a panel made up of four individuals representing different organisations - Adam Ronaldson (Chief Executive, Saffron Housing), Andy Jarvis (Head of Environmental Services at South Norfolk and Broadland District Councils), Oliver Chapman (Partner, TW Gaze Ltd) & Peter Gillings (local businessman) - who found the time and courage to be questioned on what is still an uncertain future for service provision in Diss. This was a complex task but one that they tackled brilliantly.

In summary, the conference agreed that the way forward was with all parties working together to investigate options for taking on service delivery in the future and in developing Neighbourhood Plans. Feedback forms from representatives revealed that 14 parish councils and 6 businesses were interested in working with Diss Town Council over future delivery of services and projects. Over the next few weeks we hope to make further progress and work with these interested parties to develop plans for the good of our community. The first step in this process involves working with the community and the County Council to find options for keeping the Diss Youth Resource Base in Shelfanger Road open.

There have been 16 recipients of this award since the scheme started in 1994, the latest of whom is Anne Dutton, pictured here receiving the award from Town Mayor Adrian Kitchen in December 2010. Anne was nominated for the award in recognition of her fundraising work for the British Heart Foundation over a period of 20 years.

In this time she has helped to raise around £250,000 for the charity by organising a number of events in particular the annual sponsored swim at Diss Swim & Fitness Centre. In addition Anne



is also involved with fundraising for East Anglian Air Ambulance, East Anglian Children's Hospices and acts as Secretary for the Friends of Diss Health Centre. Anne was presented with a framed certificate and bouquet of flowers and her name will be inscribed on the Roll of Honour in the Council Chamber.

Town Council Elections May 2011

Town and Parish Council elections will be held on Thursday 5th May. These are held every four years and at term end all Councillors stand down and have to seek re-election if they wish to remain in office. Anyone who meets the eligibility criteria can also apply to stand for election to the Council.

Over the past four years the Council has achieved a great deal, here are just some of the projects undertaken and improvements made since the last elections in 2007.

Improvements to Council facilities & amenities:

- New railings and beds planted along Madgetts Walk.
- Resurfacing of Mere's Mouth.
- Improvements to the facilities at the Sports Ground.
- Establishment of a Dog Control Order and the installation of many more dog bins in various locations.
- Introduction, in partnership with the Police and South Norfolk Council, of the DPPO giving powers to the police to confiscate alcohol from those acting in an anti-social manner in public places within the zone.
- Resurfacing of the Entry footpath.
- Installation of new grit bins on Town Council properties and assistance with the fitting of bins purchased by residents of several

residential areas in the town.

Projects & Events:

- Taken on responsibility for organising and funding (helped by some donations from businesses) of the Christmas Lights display and switch-on event.
- Facilitated the rejuvenation of Diss Carnival which has now become established as annual event in the town's calendar.
- Completed the first stage of the Park Regeneration Project with the installation of new junior and toddler play areas and received funding from the Big Lottery Awards for All to progress the next stage.
- Achieved Quality Parish Council status.
- Supported the setting up of Diss Youth Council in 2009 and the organisation of the annual Youth Expo.
- Initiated the Corn Hall Regeneration Project with the appointment of a Project Co-ordinator in 2009 which has resulted in the setting up of the Corn Hall Trust to manage the facility and progress the project.



With an active four years behind the Town Council the next council term looks like it will be just as busy and even more challenging. Cuts in government funding to higher tier authorities announced in the Comprehensive Spending Review and the Localism Bill, in addition to the Council's current responsibilities and projects means that there may be a number of opportunities for Diss to take on more services and work in partnership with other councils.

You could be a part of this process by standing for election in May. The procedure is the same for both new candidates and former councillors who have to complete a form supplied by the Returning Officer at

South Norfolk Council and be nominated by two people who are electors of Diss parish. Forms are also available at the Town Council offices. Nominations must be submitted to South Norfolk Council no later than 12 noon on 4th April.

Being a Town Councillor can be rewarding and interesting and is a way of putting something back into the community. Prospective candidates will need to have a great interest in Diss and be prepared to give up some of their time to attend meetings and help with Council projects and events. Candidates must be over 18 and be either a Diss resident, work in Diss or own property in the town. Contact South Norfolk Council on 0808 1682000 for more information.

and refreshments to make this a fun and rewarding Youth Expo.

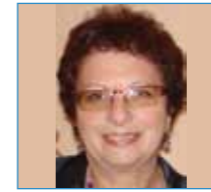

Award-winning Diss Museum is well into its latest project, *Friends in High Places: The Manning Story*.
